Rules and Conditions of Entry

Acceptance of these rules is a condition of entry

Entrance Criteria

- > The World Land Trust Limerick Competition is open for entries from all
- There are no age group categories. Children under the age of 16 should obtain the permission of their parent or guardian before entering
- > Entries must conform to the established five line limerick format. Examples:

There was an Old Man with a beard, Who said, 'It is just as I feared! Two Owls and a Hen, Four Larks and a Wren, Have all built their nests in my beard!' The endangered Blue-throated Macaw Is a bird that twitchers adore. There are very few left, And we'd all be bereft If the Blue-throated Macaw was no more.

- Limericks submitted must broadly reflect the history, mission or activities of World Land Trust. For more information about World Land Trust, see <u>www.worldlandtrust.org</u>
- All entries must be the original work of the entrant, and must not infringe the intellectual property of others. Should WLT become aware of any claim of copyright infringement, the entry will be removed from any communications controlled by WLT
- Maximum three entries per person
- Entries must be submitted by noon on Friday 5 April 2013 (British Summer Time). Judging will take place in April 2013
- Proof of email/postage is no proof of receipt. WLT do not accept any responsibility for returning postal entries
- WLT staff are welcome to submit limericks, but entries from staff will be not be entered into the competition

- If you wish your limerick/s to be entered into the competition, you must supply your name and contact details
- If you wish to post a limerick anonymously on WLT's Facebook site, and also to have it entered into the competition, please send either by post or by email your name and contact details
- > Entries on paper must be accompanied by a completed competition form

Judging Process

- All entries will be subject to validation. Entries which in the opinion of WLT are offensive, defamatory or discriminatory will not be accepted
- > Facebook likes will be taken into account by judges

Prize & Winning Entry

- > There will be one overall winner for the competition
- The prize will be a framed, illustrated copy of the winning limerick. The winner will also have the chance to meet Bill Oddie to receive the prize personally, either in Halesworth (Suffolk) or London, at a date convenient to Bill Oddie. Alternatives to the published prize are not available
- The winning entry will be decided by a judging panel, details of which will be available upon request. The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into
- > The winner will be notified by email or phone following the judges' decision
- In order to claim the prize the winner must supply their full name, address and phone number or email address, and if under 16 their age
- The names of the winner (with pictures if appropriate) will be published on the WLT website and in other WLT publications and communications
- > If the prize is not claimed, it will be offered to the runner up
- > The winning entry will be announced on or before 30 April 2013

Promotion & Copyright

- <u>Copyright</u> for entries belongs to the author but by submitting an entry you grant WLT a non-exclusive royalty-free worldwide license to publish the entry and to use it for any promotional purpose which we choose
- > The winning entry will be published in accordance with WLT's communications policy
- During the course of the competition selected limericks may be posted (anonymously) on WLT's website or Facebook site
