Job Purpose

The role of the Technical Officer is to support the Conservation Programmes team in the expansion of its conservation work, working closely with other Conservation Programme team members to provide support for the establishment, development and monitoring of new and existing projects.

Main duties and responsibilities

- Provide technical support to the design, analysis and monitoring of the organisation's conservation projects, including involvement in WLT's carbon projects and carbon auditing.
- Work with WLT's partner organisations in the monitoring of existing and establishment of new projects including undertaking site visits where appropriate/necessary.
- Provide support to the WLT's conservation programmes and wider team as directed by the Director of Conservation.

Operational and line management

This role will report to the Director of Conservation, but will also involve close liaison with other senior managers and staff within the organisation.

- Good knowledge of the establishment and design of long-term monitoring projects (desirable).
- Knowledge of carbon, REDD+ or other payment for ecosystem service (PES) sectors (desirable).
- Knowledge of carbon auditing procedures (desirable).
- Experience of working internationally in varied cultures and countries (desirable).
